#### AMERICA

It certainly wasn't like Dollis Brook, in fact quite different. I and my two sons were each straddled across a large inner tube from a tractor tyre and we were being carried along a mountain stream about four times as wide and as twice as deep as our brook in Woodside Park. Our legs, arms and bottoms were dangling in the water which surprisingly was not too cold. We were being carried along by the fast flowing turbulent current of Smoky Creek in the great Smoky Mountain National Park in North Carolina. The power of the stream pulled us along the creek and as much as we tried to use our arms and hands to guide us away from the many smoothworn rocks, unavoidably we bumped from one rock to another turning in wild circles all the time. It was more like riding the dodgem cars on Hampstead Heath. How we survived this we will not know, but the sensation was exhilarating.

Even more thrilling was the ride that my boys with my wife and I took on the Natahla river on a rubber raft. Here we had an eight mile rush down the river as wide in places as the Thames but flowing fiercely. We even had ten foot waterfalls to descend in addition to all the rapids. All of this was a part of rural America, but is not seen by many visitors from England.

We were extremely impressed by the free facilities provided in the National Parks for picnicking, barbecuing and the excellent 'comfort rooms'. This facility also extended to many of the State Highways. Would that our Authorities also would look after their residents in such a manner.
